#### **Description:**

Over the last two decades LE agencies and individual LE deputies in the U.S. have been the subject of intense public scrutiny. The litigious condition of American society has been a key factor in the scrutiny. The very nature of police work, ie. Use of Force, High-Speed Driving and Pursuits; and Arrest, lend itself to complaints and lawsuits from those that LE deputies have contact with.

LE deputies must have a working knowledge of the developing laws relating to police civil liability and discipline. Deputies must be aware that they may be held accountable for decisions made by a court having jurisdiction over them. It is the developing law that guides police training, operations and individual conduct. A failure to recognize the importance of this area of the law can lead to serious monetary consequences for individual police officers, supervisors, police executives and police agencies as a whole. In extreme cases, a failure to follow the rules set forth by the courts can result in criminal sanctions.

The course is structured in such a way as to assist deputies and agencies in making an assessment of their particular level of risk-exposure by examining court decisions that have interpreted acceptable standards of conduct by officers.

- Tort Law and the Police
- Use of Deadly and Non-Deadly Force
- False Arrest/Malicious Prosecution/Seizure of Persons and Property
- Duty to Protect/Public Duty Doctrine
- Arrestee Suicides/Medical Needs of Prisoners
- High-Speed Pursuit and Emergency Vehicle Operation
- Liability of Supervisors and Agency Liability
- Risk Assessment/Risk Reduction
- Qualified Immunity
- New Legal Trends in the Area of Police Liability
