Nampa Police and Region 3 Mental Health are hosting a 40 hour academy for **Crisis Intervention Team** (CIT) training. This training is geared primarily to Law Enforcement officers. This course will cover information about the most prevalent mental illnesses that officers routinely come into contact with. Officers will be taught de-escalation techniques making contacts with mentally ill persons in crisis safer. Instructors for this course include officials from Region 3 Mental Health, Boise V.A., Nampa Police, a Canyon County Judge, and private clinicians. CIT is a collaboration between Law Enforcement, families of the mentally ill, and Mental Health agencies, both public and private. This course will give the officer more options when dealing with the mentally ill. The goal of CIT is to have fewer contacts with mentally ill persons in crisis, and when contacts are made that they are safer for the Officer and the mentally ill. This training is provided on a **no cost** basis to all local law enforcement agencies.
