Nampa Police and the Department of Health and Welfare are hosting a 40 hour: **Crisis Intervention Team** (CIT) training. This training is primarily geared towards Law Enforcement officers. CIT is a community-based collaboration between law enforcement, NAMI (National Alliance for the Mentally Ill), mental health consumers, their families, advocates and mental health providers. The purpose of the program is to provide law enforcement officers with the tools needed to more effectively manage incidents involving mentally ill people in crisis. Officers will learn de-escalation techniques to utilize in the field, making contacts with mentally ill persons in crisis safer. Presenters for this course include professionals from Region III Mental Health, NAMI, Nampa Police Department, SPAN Idaho, Meridian Police Department, Boise Police Department, Veteran's Network, District 3 Court, Canyon County Sheriff's Office and West Valley Medical Center.

Included in this 40 hour Academy is a one day training on advanced de-escalation. Ellis Amdur, M.A. will present "Grace Under Fire for Law Enforcement - The De-escalation and Calming of Aggressive and Emotionally Disturbed Individuals".
