This presentation will cover general principles of threat assessment, as well as threat assessment in schools. Presenters will address how to identify, assess, and manage potential threats, as well as how to set up a school threat assessment team. Presentations will focus on the "assessment" phase, and how to conduct an investigation into students who pose a risk of violence. Presenters include examples from actual cases that focus on attackers' prior histories, motives, and pre-attack behaviors. This presentation focuses on proactive prevention of school violence, instead of how to respond after the fact. Attendance is free. Idaho POST certified.
