Audience: This 2-day course is specifically designed for command staff: Chiefs, Sheriffs and 911 Directors. **Course Description:** This course will provide an orientation to issues related to missing children's cases including effective policies and practices, technical assistance, training, and available resources. We also cover working with the media, developing a Law-Enforcement strategy, and a community self-assessment. **Costs:** NCMEC will provide coffee in the morning and lunch onsite during the training days and will cover registration fees, training materials, and instructor fees. NCMEC will also reimburse attendees for up to two nights of lodging up to the government rate plus tax*.

Audience: This 1-day course was developed to provide critical information for officers, call-takers, dispatchers, and investigators who would be responding to a missing child call, or involved in the investigation of a missing child case. **Course Description:** Topics covered include: Scope & Scale of Missing Children Incidents, Sex Offender Typology, Intra & Inter-Agency Law Enforcement Response, Department Policy & Procedures, Pre-Incident Planning, NCMEC Investigative/Support Resources, and Implementation of Planned Responses. **Costs:** NCMEC may provide, depending on response a continental breakfast and lunch onsite and will cover registration fees, training materials, and instructor fees.
