Nampa Police and Region III Mental Health are hosting a 40 hour: **Crisis Intervention Team** (CIT) training. This training is primarily geared towards Law Enforcement officers. CIT is a community-based collaboration between law enforcement, NAMI (National Alliance for the Mentally Ill), mental health consumers, their families, advocates and mental health providers. The purpose of the program is to provide law enforcement officers with the tools needed to more effectively manage incidents involving mentally ill people in crisis. Officers will be taught de-escalation techniques to utilize in the field, making contacts with mentally ill persons in crisis safer. Participants for this course include professionals from Region III Mental Health, NAMI, Nampa Police Department, SPAN Idaho, Suicide Prevention Hotline, Veteran's Network, Meridian Police Department, Canyon County Prosecutors Office and West Valley Medical Center. Ellis Amdur, M.A. will present a one day training on advanced de-escalation.

This training is provided on a no cost basis to all local law enforcement agencies.
