## Patrol Position Announcement

November 2011

The Lewis County Sheriff's Office is announcing a current job opening for a full-time Patrol Deputy position. This is a resident position with a starting salary of \$30,763.00 to \$31,345.00 which equates to \$14.79 to 15.07 per hour depending on experience. All equipment and a take home vehicle are provided. Benefit package includes medical, dental, life insurance and PERSI Retirement Program.

### Requirements:

- Be a minimum of 21-years-old at the time of hire
- Idaho P.O.S.T. certified or certifiable
- Pass Idaho P.O.S.T. physical fitness exam
- Pass an oral interview
- Pass a background investigation and a polygraph as required

Lewis County consists of 479 square miles of rolling prairie, with steep mountain breaks on the Clearwater and Salmon Rivers. The river break areas are vegetated with Douglas Fir and Ponderosa Pine, dropping off of the gently rolling prairie into the deep river bottom canyons. The County is a large part of the Camas Prairie, a major grain-producing region in Idaho. There is an abundance of wild game including deer and elk. The population is approximately 3,756 or 7.8 people per square mile. There are two major highways passing through Lewis County, Hwy 12 and Hwy 95. There are 22 miles of the historic Lewis and Clark Trail in Lewis County. Major towns include Kamiah, Craigmont, Nezperce, Winchester, and Reubens.
